- 1. Your child will continue to receive two types of book:
  - a fully decodable e-book and a paperback book, that closely matches the phonemes (sounds) that
    have recently been taught in school, if your child is still receiving phonics teaching. They will have read
    this book three times in school prior to the book being allocated
  - a 'reading for pleasure' book to promote a love for reading

<u>Please hear your child read at least three times per week at home. Children who read regularly at home, as well as at school, make the most progress.</u>

2. If your child no longer receives phonics teaching, they will still be allocated an e book from the Big Cat Collins e library, as well as a paper copy of the book. They will read on either purple, white, gold or lime band. After 3 reads, your child may change their book.

This term, your child will be learning Multiplication and Division, Fractions and Position and Direction



Through the White Rose Scheme, your child will be learning about:

- Counting in 2's 5's and 10's, to recognise equal groups and add equal groups.
- Making arrays, make doubles and make equal groups.
- How to recognise and find half of an object or shape, to recognise and find half of a quantity.
- How to recognise and find a quarter of an object or shape, to recognise and find a quarter of a quantity.
- How to describe turns and positions left, right, forwards, backwards, above and below and to understand ordinal numbers.

#### Science

Teaching unit: The Human Body



During this module children will be recapping previous knowledge on the human body and then will be understanding more about the five senses, understand how we use our eyes to see, that sounds travel through our eyes to send messages to our brain and to inform them about sensory impairments.

#### **Homework Project**

Homework { At the end of every term, a selection of homework projects will be sent home for your child to complete. They may select any of the projects set. Projects will be linked to the learning that will take place in the following term. 5 dojos will be presented on completion of a project.

## For **5 dojos**:

#### "My Neighbourhood Map"

- Create a map of your neighbourhood, including important landmarks such as our school, park, library, and local stores.
- You can use symbols or pictures to represent each landmark and include a key on the map.
- Try and label the streets and discuss directions (e.g., north, south, east, west) while creating the map.

Weekly homework will be sent home every Friday and should be returned to school the following Wednesday at the latest. Again, dojos will be given as a reward for completing homework.

#### Weekly homework:

- Read school reading book at least x3 weekly. Please record that your child has read in their reading record, as we collate and record all reads every Friday and award Dojo points.
  - READING BOOKS MUST BE SENT IN TO SCHOOL DAILY IN ORDER FOR YOUR CHILD TO COMPLETE THEIR DAILY READING PRACTICE.
- Spellings linked to phonics or spelling pattern taught during the week.
